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Income	Examples	Notes	Amounts
Business Revenue	Sales of products or fees for services provided to customers		
Interest Income	Interest earned on bank accounts or bonds held in business name		
Dividend Income	Dividends from stocks or mutual funds held in business name		
Asset Sale Proceeds	Income from sale of business equipment, property and investments		
Deductions	Examples	1	
Advertising	Cost of advertisements, promotional items, marketing fees		
Automobile Expenses	Business vehicle gas, oil, and repair costs; interest on vehicle loans; parking and tolls paid; depreciation (write off) of vehicle cost over a number of years, or deduction of lease payments; to simplify record keeping, can take a standard mileage rate per business mile instead of actual expenses.		
Bank Fees	Monthly bank service charges, returned check fees, credit card annual fees		
Depreciation	Write off over a number of years the cost of buildings, equipment, vehicles and business aquisition costs (amortization); certain equipment items can be written off immediately, subject to certain limits.		
Dues and Publications	Business organization dues, subscriptions to newspapers and trade magazines		
Entertainment	Customer and business associate meals, sporting events, theatre.		
Equipment Rental	Rental tools, computer leases		
Insurance	Business liability insurance, auto insurance, workers compensation insurance		
Interest Expense	Interest paid on business loans, auto loans; finance charges on business credit cards		
Licenses and Permits	Business licenses, corporate filing fees, construction permits
